Narrative

On the above date and time I responded to the area of SR 34 and Blackbriar Drive for a report of a Motor Vehicle Accident (MVA) called in by Sgt. Panepinto #57.

Upon arrival I observed a white Honda facing northbound in the southbound lane surrounded by a large debris field. I positioned my vehicle north of the motor vehicle accident near the top of the hill for officer safety. Once I walked over to the accused vehicle, I observed heavy front end damage with all airbags deployed and the still vehicle running. I met with the driver, later identified as Ruby Arena sitting in the drivers seat. Upon speaking with her I observed her eyes to be bloodshot, glassy, and slurring her speech. Ruby began to repeat the car is old and she was unsure of why the air bags went off "because I didn't hit anything". When I told her she hit the guard rail on both sides of the road she stated "I don't remember hitting anything what so ever, because I didn't hit anything." I asked Ruby to step out of the vehicle, at this time she began to fumble with the door handle and lock before finally being able to open it. Once she stepped out of the vehicle she immediately began to sway and stagger as she walked. I advised her multiple times to walk to the back of her car before she complied. Ruby continued to stutter and explain the airbags went off because it's an old car and not because she hit anything. I told Ruby to look at the damage in efforts to explain to her she hit a guard rail, at which time she stated the car was always like that. During this time she walked back to the vehicle to look at it while swaying and staggering her steps.

I had Ruby walk into the shoulder of the road when the ground was level and there was no debris from her vehicle to perform standard field sobriety tests (SFST) which she agreed to perform. I asked Ruby if she had any alcohol tonight, she replied while stuttering, "no, probably about 5 years ago, 5 hours ago I had a Surfside or two". When I asked what flavor she laughed and stated she didn't know "whatever they had at the bar, probably a half and half."

Walk and Turn Test:

The First test I administered was the Walk and Turn test. I asked her if she had any injuries that affected her balance, she advised she did not. I explained and showed Ruby the starting position. I then explained and showed her how to perform then test which she stated she understood. Ruby began the test and began to walk with her arms waving out for balance and not counting out loud as instructed. During this Ruby was swaying and not walking heel to toe as instructed. She also did not take series of small step to turn around as instructed. I then reminded her to count out loud with each step as she began to walk back. She did so when told however, got progressively quieter in her tone of voice until she stopped counting again. Again, she had her arms out for balance and was not walking heel to toe. This concluded the test.

One Leg Stand Test:

The second test I administered was the One Leg Stand. I explained and showed Ruby how to perform the test. While explaining Ruby fell out of the starting position by having her feet apart and her hand on her hips. Once she stated she understood how to perform the test she began. At this time she raised her foot only approximately one inch off the ground and waved her arms out to the side for balance. She counted out loud very quietly and began to whisper.

At this time Ptl. Campan #56 preformed HGN on Ruby. See his supplemental report for further.

At this time due to my observations and her performance on SFST I placed Ruby under arrest for DWI 39:4-50. I placed Ruby in double locked handcuffs behind her back and placed her in the prisoner compartment of my vehicle (#24). I patted her down with the back of my hand yielding negative results for weapons or contraband. It should be noted the compartment was checked before and after with negative results for contraband. I advised Monmouth County

Radio Room (MCRR) that I would be transporting the female in custody to headquarters; starting and ending mileage was logged with MCRR, mobile video recorder (MVR) / body worn camera (BWC) activated.

Upon arrival at CNPD headquarters I parked my vehicle in the sally port and secured my firearm in gun locker #1. I then took Ruby out of the car and began to walk her into the processing area. As soon as I opened the rear door I immediately smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from Ruby's breathe. I continued to smell this strong odor emanating from Ruby's breath during the duration of our interaction.

I had her sit on the processing bench and handcuffed her to the bench with one arm and double locked handcuffs. At this time Ptl. Mason #66 and I began to process Ruby. At 0230hrs I started the 20 minute face to face observation period. I read her the New Jersey Attorney General's Standard Statement, which she replied "yes" to. Ruby continually asked to use the bathroom as she needed to urinate. I advised Ruby she would be able to go after the 20 minutes is up and testing is completed she she stated was okay. After the 20 minutes was complete without burping, vomiting, or putting anything in her mouth Ptl. Mason began to complete the Alcotest breathe testing. See his report for further.

Once completed Ptl. Mason advised Ruby's test yielded a result of .158% BAC.

I called Ruby's father Roberto Arena on the department landline with a number provided by Ruby. I advised Roberto of the situation and that she needed to be picked up in accordance with John's Law. Shortly after, Roberto Arena responded to HQ in order to take her home and sign off the Potential Liability Warning (NJSAA-50.22). Ptl. Mason explained this to Roberto and signed the form. Ruby was released to Roberto at 03:55hrs.

On Thursday, 5/23/24 @ 0203hrs Sgt. Panepinto advised dispatch that he was out with single car MVA, car vs. guardrail at SR 34/Black Briar Dr. I arrived on scene and observed a white hatchback Honda with heavy front damage air bag deployment and the roadway covered with debris. The accused vehicle was also facing NE in the SB lane of travel.

Upon arrival Ptl. Perkins was on location and I observed him assisting the driver out of the vehicle. I exited my patrol car and spoke with Sgt. Panepinto who was directing traffic. Ptl. Perkins brought the driver, later identified as Ruby Arena, to a spot in the roadway that was flat and clear of debris in the roadway. Ptl. Perkins conducted Standard Field Sobriety Tests on Ms. Arena. with her consent (see initial report). I assisted Ptl. Perkins with doing Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN) on Ms. Arena.

SFST:

HORIZONTAL GAZE NYSTAGMUS:

I asked Ms. Arena before conducting the test if she had anything wrong with her eyes or was injured, she stated no. I instructed Ms. Arena to stand with her feet together with her hands at her side. I utilized a writing pen holding the pen 12"-15" away from Ms. Arena's face just above eye level. I observed Ms. Arena's eyes to be watery and can smell an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her mouth. I asked Ms. Arena if she could see the writing pen I was holding, she stated yes, I then asked her to touch the tip of the pen with her finger. Ms. Arena missed the tip of the pen on the first try and touched the tip on the second try. I instructed Ms. Arena to follow the tip of the writing pen with just her eyes keeping her head still and straight. Mrs. Arena stated she understood the instructions. I began the test of Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus. I observed lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes. Distinct and sustained nystagmus was observed prior to 45 degrees.

Once the test was completed, Ptl. Perkins placed Ms. Arena under arrest for DWI.

I stood by for Boundary Line Auto to tow the vehicle away for John's Law. Vehicle was towed without incident. Business card for the tow yard was brought back to police headquarters for Ms. Arena.

On Thursday, May 23rd, 2024 at approximately 0200 hours, I was traveling south on SR 34. As I was approaching Blackbriar Dr. I observed what appeared to be a headlight in the area of the centerline of the roadway and the south bound lane of SR 34. I moved my vehicle into the north bound lane of SR 34 in order to not collide with the vehicle. As I got closer to the vehicle, I observed it to not be moving. I observed heavy front end damage to the vehicle. I observed dirt, rocks and vehicle debris in the shoulder and roadway, in the area of the accident. I observed significant damage to the guard rail on the north bound side of SR 34.

I radioed dispatch advising them I would be out with a motor vehicle accident on SR 34 in the area of Blackbriar Dr. I also requested Ptl. Perkins respond to the area. I provided dispatch with the vehicle registration (NJ Y15MPN) and asked for a read back on the registered owner. I approached the vehicle and observed fluid leaking from the vehicle and multiple airbags deployed. I observed a sole female occupant (identified as Ruby Arena) in the drivers seat. I asked Ms. Arena if she was okay and asked her what happened. Ms. Arena stated her airbags went off and she didn't know why. Ms. Arena stated she was driving fine and her air bags exploded.

Ms. Arena stated multiple times she didn't hit anything and her airbags went off out of nowhere. I asked Ms. Arena where she was coming from and she stated Belmar. Ms. Arena was asked numerous times if she was injured and okay and she advised she was okay. Dispatch then advised they received an automated message from the iPhone crash detection that an owner of an iPhone was involved in a crash at my location. I requested a tow truck for heavy front end damage to Ms. Arena's vehicle.

At this time, Ptl. Perkins arrived on location and I also requested Ptl. Campan respond to my location. I advised Ptl. Perkins to park his vehicle at the top of the hill on SR 34, blocking the south bound lane to keep the scene safe from passing traffic. Ms. Arena again confirmed she wasn't hurt and advised the car wouldn't move. I advised Ms. Arena it appeared she hit the guardrail but Ms. Arena stated from what she knew, she didn't hit anything. I asked Ms. Arena where in Belmar she was coming from and she advised her sister's.

Ms. Arena again confirmed she wasn't injured and didn't want first aid. I advised Ptl. Perkins to stand by with Ms. Arena. Ptl. Campan arrived on scene and I advised him of what occurred. I attempted to clear the north bound lane of the roadway of debris. I advised Ptl. Perkins to take Ms. Arena out of the vehicle and begin Standard Field Sobriety Tests. I requested Ptl. Campan stand by with Ptl. Perkins for the testing. At this time Ptl. Mason arrived on location and advised him of what occurred. Ptl. Mason advised he can see where it appeared Ms. Arena's vehicle hit something on a driveway, just south of where we were located. I advised Ptl. Mason to go back and check the area to see if he could locate other things she might have struck.

I advised Ptl. Perkins to bring Ms. Arena to a dry, level area to begin Standard Field Sobriety Tests. I continued to try and clear debris from the roadway to make it passable for other vehicles. Ptl. Mason advised me via radio Ms. Arena's vehicle hit a mailbox from 785B SR 34.

I met with Ptl. Perkins and Ptl. Campan and the determination was made to arrest Ms. Arena for Driving Under the Influence. Ptl. Campan gathered Ms. Arena's belongings from her vehicle and placed them in Ptl. Perkin's patrol vehicle. Ptl. Perkins placed Ms. Arena in his patrol vehicle and transported her to headquarters. I advised Ptl. Mason to return to headquarters with Ptl. Perkins to assist and administer the testing for the Alcotest 9510. See Ptl. Perkins report for further.

On the above date and time I, Patrolman Brian Mason #66, responded to the above area for a motor vehicle accident that was located by Sgt. Panepinto. While arriving on scene, I observed debris on the side of the road, approximately 40 yards south from where the accident occurred. I made contact with Sgt. Panepinto who advised me on the incident. I advised him that I had observed debris south of the accident and I believed it was from the same vehicle. I responded to the area and observed the mailbox to 785B SR-34 had been completely destroyed, I advised the same to Sgt. Panepinto. I then responded back to where the vehicle was located and stood by for traffic control.

I was advised by Sgt. Panepinto that the driver had been placed under arrest for DWI, and he requested I respond to HQ to run the Alcotest 9510 on the subject in custody, Ruby Arena. On arrival to HQ, Ptl. Perkins escorted Ms. Arena into the processing area and seated her on a bench, where she was secured by a single handcuff. I then began my twenty minute observation period. Her mouth was visually checked and found to be negative for any foreign objects. During the observation period she did not burp, belch, vomit or touch her face or mouth. The mandatory twenty minute observation period was conducted continuously and uninterrupted. It was completed without incident. The twenty minute was time stamped via MCRR starting at 0230 hours and ending at 0251 hours. On the completion of the 20 minute observation I prepared the machine for the tests. Patrols removed all electronical devices from our persons and from Ms. Arena person. All devices were placed into a separate room. I conducted four breath samples, due to the first and third tests failing. It should be noted the mouth piece was changed after each breath sample and she was read the instructions that are located above the Alcotest machine, verbatim. At the conclusion of the test, Ms. Arena returned with a BAC of .158%, this was found to be within acceptable tolerance. The same was then provided to Ptl. Perkins. Unit clear.







N.J. ATTORNEY GENERAL'S STANDARD STATEMENT
FOR MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATORS (N.J.S.A. 39:4-50.2(e))
(revised & effective July 1, 2012)

Enter Defendant's Name Ruby Arena

The police officer shall read the following:

1. You have been arrested for driving while intoxicated. N.J.S.A. 39:4-50.
2. The law requires you to submit samples of your breath for the purpose of testing to determine alcohol content.
3. A record of the taking of the breath samples, including the test results, will be made. Upon your request, a copy of that record will be made available to you.
4. After you have provided samples of your breath for testing, you have the right, at your own expense, to have a person or physician of your own selection take independent samples of your breath, blood or urine for independent testing.
5. If you refuse to provide samples of your breath, you will be issued a separate summons for the refusal. A court may find you guilty of both refusal and driving while intoxicated.
6. If a court finds you guilty of the refusal, you will be subject to various penalties, including license revocation of up to 20 years, a fine of up to \$2000, installation of an ignition interlock, and referral to an Intoxicated Driver Resource Center. These penalties may be in addition to penalties imposed by the court for any other offense of which you are found guilty.
7. You have no legal right to have an attorney, physician or anyone else present for the purpose of taking the breath samples. You have no legal right to refuse to give, or delay giving, samples of your breath.
8. Any response from you that is ambiguous or conditional, in any respect, to my request that you provide breath samples, will be treated as a refusal to submit to breath testing. Even if you agree to take the test, but then do not follow my instructions, do not properly perform the test, or do not provide sufficient breath samples, I will charge you with refusal to submit to breath testing.
9. I repeat, the law requires you to submit samples of your breath for testing. Will you submit the samples of your breath?

Answer Yes

If the arrested person does not respond, or gives any ambiguous or conditional answer short of an unequivocal "yes," the police officer shall read the following.

Your answer is not acceptable. The law requires that you submit samples of your breath for breath testing. If you do not answer, or answer with anything other than "yes," I will charge you with refusal. Now, I ask you again, will you submit to breath testing?


