

ARREST DESCRIPTION

Karen Gebbie was arrested for 39:4-50.

On Sunday, March 12, 2023, at approximately 1534 hours, while on patrol in marked K9 vehicle 1826 and equipped with body worn camera #27, I observed a darker color sports utility vehicle traveling westbound On Main Street at a high rate of speed. I activated my patrol vehicle's radar unit and observed a target speed of seventy-seven miles per hour in a posted forty-five mile per hour zone on Main Street. I was able to catch up to the vehicle and observed a Tennessee registration of [REDACTED] I activated my emergency lights and conducted a motor vehicle stop on Main Street near Ely Road. After approaching the vehicle, and making contact with the operator who was later identified as Karen Gebbie, I immediately detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from within the vehicle. I requested the license, registration, and insurance from Karen as I took notice to her watery and bloodshot red eyes. I asked Karen why she was driving so fast and she stated "I don't know" as she spoke in a low toned and slurred voice. After fumbling around the vehicle and her pockets for the required documents, Karen stated that she did not have anything on her. Karen also advised that the vehicle was a rental car.

I asked Karen where she was headed, and she stated that she was going to the Extended Stay Hotel in Red Bank. I asked Karen if she had been there before and she replied that she has. I then informed Karen that she was going the opposite direction as she looked at me confused. I asked Karen if she had consumed any alcoholic drinks or narcotics to which she stated no. I then observed a small bottle of Sutter Home wine at the feet of Karen that was on the floorboard. The bottle did not have a cap on it and there was still wine in the bottle. I then ask Karen what the bottle on the floor was, and she replied "a wine bottle". I asked Karen again if she had consumed the wine and she replied "I did. At eight o'clock this morning". At that time, I had Karen pass me the open bottle and she also passed me a full bottle of the same size as well. I also had Karen turn the keys to the vehicle over. I returned to my patrol vehicle to conduct a look up of the license of Karen. After retrieving a driving license for Karen, I then returned to her and ordered her out of the vehicle in order to conduct Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFST), to which she complied. Karen was directed to a flat surface that was free from debris to perform the SFST's. While standing in front of Karen speaking with her, I was able to detect the odor of alcoholic beverages emanating from her breath.

The first test I administered was Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN) test. Prior to the test, I asked Karen to demonstrate her ability to identify the tip of my pen (stimulus) by touching it with her right index finger. She complied and did so. I instructed Karen to stand up straight with her feet together and to keep her arms down at her side. I held my pen approximately twelve inches away from Karen's nose with the tip of my pen just above her eye level. I instructed her to keep her head still and to follow the tip of my pen with her eyes without moving her head. I asked Karen if he understood the directions and she replied in the affirmative. I observed that Karen displayed lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes and onset of nystagmus prior to forty-five degrees in both eyes. Karen also had to be instructed to keep her head still numerous times as well as following the pen with her eyes.

The next SFST I attempted to administer was the walk and turn. I advised Karen that I would demonstrate and explain the test. Karen was instructed to stand with her right foot in front of her left foot, touching heel to toe. She was instructed to keep her hands down at her sides and to remain in this position until the start of the test. After staggering and losing her balance while trying to get into the starting position, Karen had begun walking without receiving any instruction to do so. It was at that point when Karen became irate and started to

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use profanity. While being argumentative, Karen stated "leave me the fuck alone" as she continued to walk. After multiple opportunities to perform the SFST, Karen refused to listen as she staggered towards her vehicle. It was at that point in time when I decided to place Karen under arrest for driving while intoxicated. While Ptl. Enzerillo #107 and I attempting to gain control of Karen's arms so that she could be handcuffed, she resisted by continuously pulling her arms away. After Karen was finally secured in handcuffs, she was secured in the rear of Ptl. Enzerillo's patrol vehicle. A search of the vehicle revealed multiple empty wine bottles. Karen was later transported to police headquarters without incident. I awaited the arrival of Dawn's Towing Company so the vehicle could be towed to the impound lot. After the arrival of the tow, the vehicle was taken to the township impound yard where it was secured.

Sgt. Michalski #68 conducted a twenty- minute watch where he also advised of Miranda Warning and read the Standard Statement to Karen (See Supplemental). Karen was later transported to the New Jersey State Police Holmdel Barracks by Ptl. Ketcham #92 where he conducted another twenty- minute watch and read the Standard Statement again to Karen (See Supplemental). Ptl. Ketcham later returned with Karen where he provided results for Karen with a blood alcohol content of 0.13%. Karen was later processed and charged accordingly. Karen stated that she had no one to pick her up. Karen was secured in holding cell #3 until she would be sober enough to leave on her own after a sufficient amount of time.
