Narrative

On Sunday July 14, 2024 at approximately 0026 hours I, Ptl. Strickland #122, received a call (24HZ16218) from Dispatch stating a male named Zachary had been driving with a female, later identified as Cristina Goodwin. Zachary stated Goodwin was driving while intoxicated and stated that was the reason he left the vehicle. Zachary described the vehicle as a light blue Subaru Outback, and that Goodwin had drove off with his belongings, leaving him on Bethany road and Hillcrest road in Holmdel. After completing my previous stop I drove towards the area of the vehicle's last known location.

While in the area, Ptl. Hicks #121 spotted the vehicle heading east on Bethany road After searching the area I came to a stop sign at the intersection of Moak drive and Holmdel road in Hazlet. Here is where Ptl. Hungerford #96 and I observed a light blue Subaru Outback bearing NJ reg S47PBT, being driven by a female pass us perpendicularly heading north on Holmdel road. I pulled onto Holmdel road following the vehicle. I followed the vehicle for approximately a quarter of a mile in my marked Patrol Vehicle #47. Due to the female driving the vehicle matching the description being in close proximity to the original call, I activated my emergency lights of my marked Patrol Vehicle and conducted a Motor Vehicle stop on Holmdel road across from the Hazlet Fire Station. The stop was conducted to ensure the driver in question was not the same intoxicated female that the caller had reported.

I approached the motor vehicle on the driver side as Ptl. Hungerford approached the passenger side. I began the stop by stating my name, Department, and that my Body worn camera was activated. I asked the driver of the motor vehicle for her drivers license, registration, and proof of insurance. I observed the driver to be making slow hand movements while looking for her Identification, which led me to further believe this was her. She began talking about a male that she had been looking for in the area of Hillchester. I then asked her if she meant Hillcrest and she stated yes. Throughout my conversation with the driver I observed her speech to be fairly slow, and she was slurring her words. She would also start off her sentences in a normal volume and gradually fade lower as she turned her head away from me several times. The driver stated to have been at the PNC Bank Arts for a concert. I proceeded to ask the driver if she had any alcoholic beverages tonight, to which she stated "no". I asked for the driver's credentials again, this time the driver had her bank card in her left hand, to which I alerted the driver that it was her bank card. Ptl. Hungerford then approached on the driver side of the vehicle and asked if I had smelled the odor of an Alcoholic beverage coming from the vehicle, to which I replied yes. Due to what I observed as well as the detection of a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage and burnt marijuana, I asked Goodwin to turn the vehicle off and step out to determine her level of intoxication. Upon exiting the vehicle Goodwin was observed bracing herself with her left arm on the door frame. Goodwin was escorted to an area off the roadway that appeared to be level and clear of debris.

HGN

The first test administered was the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test by Ptl. Hungerford. See Ptl. Hungerford's supplement for further information.

One Leg Stand

The next test administered was the One leg Stand. I asked Goodwin if she had any problems with her legs, [REDACTED] Let it be noted she walked towards the testing area, approximately 50 feet, without displaying any signs of injury. [REDACTED] I explained and demonstrated the test to Goodwin and asked if she understood, to which she advised yes. During the instruction phase, Goodwin was advised multiple times to place her feet together and keep her arms at her sides. Goodwin was advised to begin the test, she was unable to lift her foot the appropriate 6 inches for the test as she kept her toes on the ground. Goodwin repeatedly placed her foot on the ground to regain balance. After the fourth time of Goodwin

falling back and to the left I concluded the test due to safety. Ptl. S. Hicks was advised to transition to Goodwin's left for safety reasons.

Walk and Turn

The next test administered was the Walk and Turn test. I explained and demonstrated the test to which Goodwin advised she understood. During the instruction phase Goodwin was advised to get into the starting position. Goodwin was observed swaying, and separate her feet to regain balance several times within the first few seconds of explaining the test. Goodwin stepped off of the line approximately three times, while also taking approximately 17 steps down. Goodwin was also observed to have taken her arms off her side multiple times for balance throughout her initial steps down. While on the return, Goodwin again stepped off the line multiple times. The test was concluded and Ptl. Hungerford advised me that he was going to conduct the Modified Romberg test.

Modified Romberg

The next test administered was the Modified Romberg Test. See Ptl. Hungerford's supplement for further information. Let it be noted that during this test, I observed Goodwin swaying side to side and back and forth.

At the conclusion of all testing, Goodwin was placed under arrest for Driving while intoxicated (N.J.S.A 39:4-50). Goodwin was placed in handcuffs, behind the back, utilizing double locking mechanism. Goodwin was placed in the back of my Patrol Vehicle. Sgt. Corcione #100 and Ptl. Hungerford then searched Goodwin's immediate area for intoxicants. At the conclusion of the search I read Goodwin her Miranda Right's, to which she advised she understood and wanted to speak with her Lawyer. Due to this there was no questioning conducted. See Ptl. Hungerford's supplement for further information. A notification was sent out for a female Officer for the search of Goodwin's person. Goodwin was then transported to Union Beach Headquarters to conduct the Alcotest, without incident.

While at Union Beach Police Headquarters, Goodwin was not read her Miranda Right's due to her waiving them earlier on the stop. I then read her the Attorney General's standard statement form, to which she responded "Of course", I then asked Goodwin if that was a yes, she replied "absolutely". I then checked Goodwin's mouth, which was clear of any foreign objects, and began the 20 minute observation period. Ptlw. McQuade #399, of Middletown Police Department, arrived and conducted a search of Goodwin with negative findings. Let it be noted that Ptlw. McQuade's arrival was during the 20 minute observation. Being that she was taken into the cell for the search, I again checked for foreign objects, which was negative, and restarted the 20 minute observation. During the 20 minute observation Goodwin did not belch, vomit, or put anything into her mouth. At the conclusion of 20 min, Ptl. N. Hungerford was advised and he began the Alcotest.

Alcotest

Ptl. Hungerford administered the Alcotest. See Ptl. Hungerford's supplement for further information. At the conclusion of the test, Ptl. Hungerford did advise me that Goodwin had a BAC of .044%.

Goodwin was then transported back to Police Headquarters, without incident, for further processing. The rear of my Patrol Vehicle was checked for contraband before the arrest, and after Goodwin's exit with negative findings. Believing the observed impairment did not match the BAC level, along with the CDS found in the vehicle, a DRE evaluation was requested. I met with Lt. Marvel #71 (DRE) who suggested I read Goodwin her Miranda Right's again. After reading her Miranda Right's she stated she understood them and did not want to answer any questions. After this Lt. Marvel stated that since she waived her right's he could not conduct the DRE evaluation and stated a blood warrant would need to be obtained.

On call Assistant Prosecutor Liz Torres was contacted and briefed on what occurred during this incident. AP Torres stated she would be contacting the Judge, and would call back on a recorded line for our Testimony. After a short period of time, AP Torres called us back with Judge Peter Lucas. After hearing Ptl. Hungerford's testimony he approved the warrant and gave permission to sign his name. A blood sample withdraw form and a duplicate original search warrant form were filled out. Goodwin was transported to Bayshore Community Hospital for the blood draw. Once at the hospital I advised the nurse that we were there for a blood draw. RN [REDACTED] assisted with the blood draw. Once Goodwin was discharged both her and the blood sample were transported back to Police Headquarters. The blood was then secured into evidence fridge A. All other evidence was secured in evidence locker 10.

At this time Goodwin's father, Robert Goodwin, had arrived at Police Headquarters. I met him in the lobby and explained to him the potential liability form, to which he understood and signed off on the release of Goodwin. Goodwin was given her complaints and summons, to which she was explained her court dates. She was given back all property and released to Robert pending court.

Supplement

On July 14, 2024 at approximately 0026hrs I, Ptl. Nicholas Hungerford #96, was assigned as a Field Training Officer to Ptl. Strickland #122. Dispatch alerted patrols that a male had called stating he was in a blue Subaru Outback with an intoxicated female driver. The male caller exited the vehicle on Bethany Rd near the intersection of Hillcrest Rd in Holmdel and the female driver was driving around with his belongings in the vehicle. Ptl. Hic #121 arrived on scene first and advised that the male was no longer in the area. Upon hearing this, Ptl. Strickland began to search the area for the the vehicle. While searching the area of Moak Dr and approaching the intersection of Holmdel Rd, I observed a light blue Subaru Outback with a blonde female driver driving on Holmdel Rd towards Highway 35. Ptl. Strickland then got behind the vehicle and activated him emergency lights to conduct a motor vehicle stop on Holmdel Rd near the Fire Station.

Ptl. Strickland approached the driver side and made contact with the female driver, later identified as Cristina Goodwin (see Ptl. Strickland's report for more information). I approached the passenger side, which had the window closed. I then observed Cristina trying to locate her credentials to hand to Ptl. Strickland. Her hand movements were slow and she was unable to locate any of the documents. At one point she grabbed a bank card and tried to present that. I then walked around to Ptl. Strickland and asked if he could detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the vehicle, which he stated he did. I then told him to have her exit the vehicle to perform Standardized Field Sobriety tests. When Cristina was out of the vehicle she was escorted off the roadway to an area that appeared to be flat and clear of debris. I then began the tests by conducted the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test.

HGN

I began by having Christina get into the starting position. I then showed her the stimulus, tip of my pen, and instructed her to follow that when I moved it with her eyes and her eyes only. I asked if she understood, which she stated yes. I then began with check for equal tracking and equal pupil size, which she had. I then moved to lack of smooth pursuit, which was not present in wither eye. Then I looked for Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus at maximum deviation, which was also not present. Next, I looked for Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus onset of 45 degrees, which was not present. I finished by testing for Vertical Gaze Nystagmus, which again was not present. It should be noted that I observed Cristina's eyes to be blood shot. He pupils were also enlarged and did not react to my flashlight.

After concluding HGN, Cristina was directed to Ptl. Strickland for the remainder of the tests. While observing the balance tests, Cristina was having a difficult time keep her balance. There was continual leaning for balance and she would hop on one leg to regain her balance. Cristina also lifted her hands from her side for balance on numerous occasions. After seeing this and the impairment level not matching HGN, I decided to retest HGN. After the second time, I gain found zero hits. I then told Cristina I would be conducting the Modified Rhomberg test.

Modified Rhomberg

I began by placing Cristina in the starting position. She was then told to stay like this while I explained the rest of the test. I asked if she understood, which she stated she understood. When I told her to begin, she tilted her head slightly back with her eyes open. I then corrected her and she began to do the test correctly. During the test, Cristina would sway side to side and front to back. She also went over the 30 seconds that I told her to estimate. At one point she even began to count out loud. Cristina also started the test before being told to do so.

At this point, Cristina was placed under arrest for DWI. Ptl. Strickland and Ptl. Hicks escorted her to the rear of patrol vehicle #47, where she was secured in the rear. Sgt. Corcione and myself then began a search of the vehicle for intoxicants. When I approached the driver side of the vehicle, I detected a strong odor of burnt Marijuana coming from the vehicle. Sgt. Corcione went to the passenger side of the vehicle. While there, Sgt. Corcione advised me that he saw a large foil zip lock bag sticking out from Cristina open hand bag. When he removed it, he found mushrooms (a Controlled Dangerous Substance commonly known as "Shrooms"). Also while searching the vehicle there were several burnt and already smoked joints in the center console of the vehicle, indicating that Marijuana had been smoked in the vehicle. There was also two marijuana vapes inside the vehicle. I then removed the bag from the vehicle and did a further search on the hood of patrol vehicle 47. During the search, I found 36 empty wax fold, which are commonly used to hold Heroin, one 30mg blue Oxycodone pill, a red cut plastic straw with residue inside and empty capsule pills that are used to ingest CDS.

Cristina was then transported to Union Beach Police Department for the Alcotest. She was read her Miranda Warning from Ptl. Strickland, which she stated she understood and that she wanted to speak to her lawyer before any questioning. She was then read the Standard Statement Form, which she stated she would give breath samples. Ptl. Strickland then started his 20 minute observation. At the conclusion of his 20 minute observation, I set up the Alcotest to collect breath samples. Cristina was able to provide two good samples. A new mouth piece was used for each sample and Cristina was read the instructional paragraph before each sample. At the conclusion of the test, the Alcotest advised she had a BAC of .04%. She was then transported to Hazlet Headquarters for the rest of the booking process. See Ptl. Strickland's report for the rest of the booking process.
