ARREST DESCRIPTION

Female Arrest 39:4-50

On 11/07/2025, I was working my routine night shift from 1900-0700. I was wearing my department issued class b uniform and was operating marked patrol vehicle number #8710.

Operation of Motor Vehicle:

While on patrol, I was travelling east bound on Eighteenth avenue in the area of the 500 block. I observed a white SUV travelling in front of me approximately one block a head of me. I observed this vehicle travel through the stop sign at the start of the 400 block of Eighteenth Avenue, without coming to a complete stop. I began to close the distance between myself and the vehicle. As I was closing the distance, I observed this same vehicle travel through the stop sign located at Eighteenth Avenue and B street. I caught up to the vehicle in the 100 block of Eighteenth Avenue. At this time, I observed the registration to be [REDACTED]. The driver turned left onto Ocean Avenue and began to travel north bound. I continued to follow behind the vehicle. I activated my emergency lights and initiated a motor vehicle stop in the area of Fourteenth Avenue and Ocean Avenue. The driver pulled over without issue.

While Stopped:

I approached the passenger side of the vehicle and made contact with a female driver, who was later identified as Maggie R Sullivan. I identified myself as Patrolman Vojtko and requested her documents. Sullivan handed me her driver's license, registration and insurance. I could smell an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the passenger compartment of her vehicle. I began to further speak with Sullivan about where she was coming from and how much she had to drink. She advised me that she was coming from a friend's house and had one tequila soda. As I continued to speak with her, I observed her speech to be slurred and her eyes to be glassy. I walked back to my vehicle and requested Patrolman Poppert #169 to respond to my location.

Once Poppert arrived, I approached the driver's side of the vehicle and asked Sullivan to step out. I could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her person once she was out of the vehicle. I also observed her to be chewing gum at this time. Patrolman Poppert administered HGN testing, see his supplemental for further.

I explained and demonstrated the walk and turn test. Sullivan advised me that she understood my instructions. Sullivan then took nine steps forward. Her steps were off balance and staggard. Once she got to the ninth step she stated that she was sorry and she was nervous. She then took nine steps back that were also staggered. Sullivan had multiple steps where she did not touch heel to toe. This concluded the walk and turn test.

I then explained and demonstrated the one leg stand test. Sullivan advised me that she understood the test. Sullivan lifted her leg and began to count. Sullivan swayed for balance. Sullivan dropped her foot to the ground three times before reaching eleven seconds. At this time, I told Sullivan to stop the test. I placed Sullivan under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated 39:4-50.

I searched Sullivan incident to arrest. While searching her I could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her person. I secured her in the prisoner compartment of my patrol vehicle. I conducted a probable cause search of the vehicle for intoxicants, which yielded negative results. Patrolman Clayton #160 arrived on scene and stayed with the vehicle until it was towed by Bennett's Auto Recovery. Bennett's towed the vehicle to their yard, where it was impounded for John's Law.

In Transport to Belmar Police Headquarters:

I transported Sullivan to Belmar Police Headquarters. She began to talk to me from the prisoner compartment of my vehicle. I observed her speech to be slurred.

At Belmar Police Headquarters:

Once at Police Headquarters, I secured Sullivan's property in the booking room and my duty weapon in a designated lock box. I escorted Sullivan out of my vehicle. I could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the prisoner compartment of my vehicle. I walked Sullivan into the booking room. I read her the N.J. Attorney General's Standard Statement For Motor Vehicle Operators (N.J.S.A. 39:4-50(e)). After reading paragraph nine, Sullivan responded with "yes". I had Sullivan spit out her gum and started a twenty minute observation period.

I read Sullivan the Monmouth County Police Uniform Miranda Warning and Waiver Form. Sullivan initialed next to each line and signed the form. I filled out the Drinking Driver/Operator Questionnaire and the last drink form. During this process Sullivan stated she had a fire ball shooter and a tequila soda. She stated that she had been taking a weight loss shot and had recently started to drink again. She advised me that she should not have been driving. I could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage fill the booking room during this period of time.

Once the observation period concluded, Poppert administered the Alcotest 9510. This showed that Sullivan's BAC was 0.178%. I issued Sullivan Summons's for Driving Under the Influence 39:4-50, Reckless driving 39:4-96 and Failure to Stop at a Stop Sign 39:4-144. I advised her of her mandatory court date of 11/19/2025 at 9am in Lake Como Municipal Court. Sullivan's brother arrived at Police Headquarter's and signed the Potential Liability Warning N.J.S.A. 39:4-50.22. Sullivan was then released from Police Custody.

Supplemental report for Case # 25BEL-24083-AR
Ptl. K. Poppert #169

On 11/08/2025 at approximately 0200 hours, I responded to Ptl. Vojtko's traffic stop on Ocean Avenue. Upon arrival, Ptl. Vojtko and the driver of the vehicle, Maggie Sullivan, were on the shoulder of the road speaking. Ptl. Vojtko asked if I could perform the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test (HGN) on Sullivan. At this time, Ptl. Vojtko turned off all forward facing emergency lights and I had Sullivan stand facing me. I asked Sullivan if she had any issues with her eyes to which she stated that she wears contacts and recently had pink eye. I asked Sullivan to follow the tip of my pen with her eyes only and do not move her head. She stated that she understood and I began the test. During the test, I observed 6 out of 6 total clues. At the conclusion of the test I advised Ptl. Vojtko of my findings and that he can continue with his testing.

I arrived back at police headquarters to assist Ptl. Vojtko with the breath test. Once Ptl. Vojtko completed Sullivan's 20 minute observation period, I entered the room. I then removed all electronics from me and checked Sullivan for electronics. Ptl. Vojtko's body worn camera was turned off and I continued an uninterrupted visual of Sullivan while escorting her into the Alcotest room. Sullivan was placed in a chair facing me while I prepared the Alcotest 9510 machine. Sullivan did not belch, vomit nor place anything in her mouth during this time. I instructed Sullivan on how to provide proper breath samples to which she stated that she understood. Sullivan provided proper breath samples and a clean mouth piece was used for each sample. The breath samples yielded a blood-alcohol reading of 0.178%.
